Unit Title: Don Stewart Inspired Object Collages

Dates of Unit: (10 class periods: Sept 27 - Oct 8)

Instructional Lessons and Activities

LESSONS:

Lesson 1: Who is Don Stewart and why is he style different then others? (Day I: Monday 9/27)

- Students will learn about the work of Don Stewart and explore different organic and inorganic objects
- Students will participate in round robin drawing circuits around the room to learn and practice drawing organic and inorganic objects overlapping

Lesson 2: Collage Planning (Day II: Tuesday 9/28)

- In the sketchbooks students will brainstorm different themes alongside lists of other objects related to that theme to draw large scale
- Students must bring in ten visual resources to draw from

Lesson 3: Collage Outlining (DAY III: Wednesday 9/29)

- Teacher will collect homework assignments (Song illustration)
 - Teacher will introduce next week's homework assignment- Draw something you value in value
- Students will begin larger scale drawings (teacher will demonstrate how to block out shapes and place value)

Lesson 4: Collage Drawing (Day IV-VI: Thursday-Monday 9/30-10/4)

- Students will create frame and wrap frame in plaster to create shoe
- Students are to think of ideas using mixed media for laces and other designs

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Lesson 5: Drawing (Day VII-X Tuesday-Friday 10/5-10/8)

- Students will continue drawing the objects with extreme detail
- Students will practice value and shading techniques
